A Note from our Treasurer:

TREASURER'S COMMENTS

Two Thousand Twenty-Two has been a pivotal year for our community. Operating income from Maintenance Fees and Dues has been consistently ahead of projections and only requiring some gentle reminders from the office to keep us financially healthy. From the beginning of the year, I have been happy to report our month-over-month available bank cash accounts have exceeded four hundred thousand dollars. The Escape's economic picture has been so robust that it became necessary to explore banking options to ensure our available funds are protected by FDIC safeguards. In other words, existing monies in various accounts exceeded the limits established by the federal government. Two CDARs or IntraFi Deposit accounts were created which allow the EPOA's Management Team to distribute funds in secure institutions while ensuring ease of access.

Earlier this year the community overwhelming approved maintaining the current Maintenance Fee expense even though the portion that was associated with Special Assessment, had matured and the bank loan satisfied. This has allowed for greater improvement planning and execution. The major portion of Escape main access roads have been repaved and we will be accelerating the schedule of resurfacing secondary streets and Cul De Sacs.

With the confidence that comes from having funds available, our Property Manager Ann Marie has been aggressively implementing improvement projects throughout the community with a focus of safety, appearance, and utilities reliability. For those residents that access water from the Walnut well, progress with identifying a new well location and filing the required permitting is moving forward. Working in concert with the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and its engineering firm Century Engineering, we hope to execute the drilling on a new well soon. In addition, as everyone is aware, our Waste Treatment Plant (WTP) has far exceeded its life expectancy but with our dedicated and knowledgeable resources the plant continues to meet demand. As mentioned in Board Meeting updates, we continue to meet with the USDA and our engineering firm KBA Engineering to provide the essential documentation for submittal. KBA Engineering is responsible for select environmental and technical deliverables with the Escape accountable for operational and financial practices and procedures. Although we have been addressing this issue for several years, we are assured of timely consideration to our funding request. Since the projected cost of a new WTP is well over a million dollars having a government secured load is extremely beneficial.

In closing I look forward to continuing to work with Ann Marie, her team, and the entire EPOA Board of Directors with forecasting how best to implement community enhancement strategies while maintaining a stable balance sheet.




